Last month in this space, I wrote about how the Holy Spirit, a.k.a the Advocate, calls us to speak up for others, to stand up for others, to accompany others in times of trial and be a helping companion. Now is one of those trying times when the Spirit is moving.

In these days when our sins of personal, societal and systemic racism have been starkly revealed once again, we are being called to lament, to speak up, to stand up, and to show up in acts of justice and reconciliation with God and one another and join in God's movement for wholeness for all of God's children.

Minister of Reconciliation Rev. April Johnson announced a new 2020 grant offering seed money to congregational, regional, and general ministries for racial reconciliation and anti-racism projects called the Rev. Ernest J. Meeting with a group of church leaders on the DOCTalks Zoom conversation hosted by the Christian Church in Virginia, Rev. Johnson asked, "If [your church] received a \$1,000 check in the mail today to do a Black Lives Matter or anti-racism program, would you share with us how you would use that \$1,000?" It was a challenging question that introduced a brainstorming session of strong ideas and possibilities. Then, she asked, "What prevents you from doing any of this [anti-racism/anti-oppression work] now?"

To do the work of the Holy Spirit is to be an advocate. West Area, what anti-racism/pro-reconciliation work is God calling us to do here in western Kentucky right now?

INTERNS ARE EXPANDING MINISTRIES

Venturing Crew to provide healthy, locally sourced food to seniors and at-risk families. First Christian Princeton has also now received a COVID Relief Ministry grant from the Week of Compassion to extend their Healthy Foods ministry for many more weeks into the summer.

TREASURER'S REPORT

MAY UPDATE ON THE WEST AREA AND CAMP KBY FINANCES

The financial picture of the Christian Church In Kentucky-West Area improved with income over expenses totaling \$5,620. This was largely thanks to two budgeted items that came in during May. They were DMF Support of \$7,500 and Smallwood Interest of \$1,115.

Our Congregational Regular giving is up \$1,673 over budgeted amount year to date due to some congregations' giving trends. We had no field travel expense due to the pandemic restrictions. We also had very little office expense. Our operational cash balance increased from \$37,885 to \$45,656 which includes a portion of the PPP Loan which may or may not have to be repaid.

Camp Kum-Ba-Ya had operational expenses in excess of income by \$5,651. Included in those expenses were some committed salaries that were paid out of PPP money which may or may not have to be repaid. There are some interesting programs the Team is putting together to help children through this pandemic. Over \$20,422 has been spent on Camp improvements. This money came out of restricted funds. The operational fund balance was \$24,951 while the restricted fund balance was \$27,967 as of May 31, 2020.
