At Camp Kum-Ba-Ya our primary mission is to respond to God's call to host spiritually enriching camps for children, youth and adults. The Billy Williams Lodge is central to that mission; it serves as our dining hall, air-conditioned gathering room, administrative office, craft room, staff showers, and winter season dormitory, . Camp Kum-Ba-Ya is embarking on a capital campaign to reach our goal of raising \$50,000 to repair and renovate the Billy Williams Lodge.

With a generous \$4,000 gift from First Christian Church of Benton and a \$14,000 draw from the Permanent Funds held by the West Area, Camp Kum-Ba-Ya began a project this spring to replace the old siding on the Billy Williams Lodge. With our 2020 summer camp season being virtual, we felt it was an ideal time to undertake this essential upgrade to the lodge. Quickly our contractors discovered that we had significant black mold problems in the outside walls of the restrooms, which were built decades ago without mold-resistant drywall. To complete the siding project now requires remediating the mold and renovating both restrooms. This campaign will also afford us the opportunity to replace the aging HVAC system. Any funds raised in excess of our project goals will be put in our Camp Revamp fund for future infrastructure projects.

In short, this capital campaign will allow us to provide a healthy, safe, and welcoming environment for our staff and guests and preserve the Billy Williams Lodge for another generation of campers. Each year hundreds of guests experience the hospitality of the Billy Williams Lodge as we host retreats, family events, church gatherings, meetings, and team-building opportunities for organizations. We love our camp, and to take care of it means being good stewards of its buildings to carry out our mission of transforming lives through spiritual enrichment in service to God.

The Christian Church In Kentucky and the West Area are partnering in this regional campaign. The region is opening a line of credit with Disciples Church Extension Fund and will use Camp Endowment funds to match campaign funds raised up to the \$50,000 goal. This is a tremendous opportunity to double the effect of your gift. Please join us in preserving our lodge for future generations.

TREASURER'S REPORT

JUNE UPDATE ON THE WEST AREA AND CAMP KBY FINANCES

The financial picture for the Christian Church In Kentucky-West Area was actually better than expected. Regular Congregation giving was up over budget by slightly over \$450. However, no additional receipts came in during June. Expenses were \$2,497 over income bringing our bank balance from operations to \$43,159.

We are still in the process of upgrading Camp Kum-Ba-Ya. Operational expenses exceeded income by \$2,876 leaving an operational bank balance of \$22,575.

Plans are in process of raising funds to complete necessary upgrades at KBY. Prospects seem very positive.
