Construction has already begun to remediate the mold and restore the restrooms. As the repairs and restorations are taking shape, we can already see the impact that your gifts are going to make in the lives of our campers and guests. Next we will replace our aging HVAC system. As gifts continue to come in, funds raised in excess of our match goal (i.e., beyond the \$50,000) are being placed in our on-going Camp Revamp fund for other building and infrastructure projects, including to resolve a leak discovered in the waterlines at camp.

FROM THE VIRTUAL DESK

The Week of Ministry is October 11-17. Since 1933, this week has been set aside to celebrate the call to ministry.

I saw that Phillips Theological Seminary is offering a ready-to-stream worship so that congregations can give their pastors a break. They write, "The seminary has created the complete digital service as a gift to pastors, congregational leaders and musicians needing a break after months of being out of their church buildings." It also made me wonder who among our leaders is in need of a break--a time for sabbath renewal. Rest is one of God's gifts to us, and as Christians it's important that we model intentional rest for one another and offer built-in rest to our leaders.

All of us disciples are called to ministry, whether we are clergy or laity, and that call is ongoing and life-long. I've heard some say, "I've served my time. It's time for someone else to do this work." The Bible shows us that we are never too young or too old to be called by God. So whether we sit in the middle of a pew, or near the pulpit, or at home on our couch during worship, God's call to serve in ministry claims each of us every day of our lives.

NEW FUND POLICY PROPOSED

In the next few weeks churches in the West Area and individuals on our emailing list will receive a mailing or email to communicate a proposal to amend and clarify language in the West Area's Permanent Fund policy. The current policy states "The policy may be amended by a 3/4 vote of the West Area Executive Committee at any regular meeting followed by a 3/4 vote at the annual or called meeting of the Board of Representatives. Written notice must be sent to West Area congregations of the proposed changes at least one month in advance of the Executive Committee meeting." The West Area Board plans to consider these changes at their November meeting, and we welcome your feedback.

KEY LEADERS OF YOUTH & CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES



TREASURER'S REPORT

AUGUST HIGHLIGHTS ON THE WEST AREA AND CAMP KBY FINANCES

September 18, 2020

West Area items:

- Total year to date receipts were \$56,633 versus eight-months budget of \$56,302.
- Congregational giving continues to be ahead of budget. We have received \$46,016 versus an eight-month budget of \$42,636.
- We had no field expenses and very little office expense. For the month we had expenses in excess of income by \$2,467, however YTD we have income in excess of expense by \$9,101.
- We were left with a positive operating cash balance of \$46,986 at August 31, 2020.
- We had very little change in restricted items.

Camp Kum-Ba-Ya items:

- We started the year with an operational cash balance of \$30,603. We ended August 2020 with an operational cash balance of \$19,920. This does not include \$10,892 in PPP money that is included in restricted funds.
- Restricted funds started the year with a balance of \$31,173 and ended August 2020 with a balance of \$48,466.
- A Capital Campaign was conducted to perform necessary repairs to the Billy Williams Lodge. The goal was \$50,000 which included \$25,000 in matching funds from CCK. We have exceeded the goal and have raised \$56,012, which includes the CCK match.
