### REGIONAL BOARD CALLS REV. DR. DON GILLETT

Rev. Dr. Donald K. Gillett II has been called as the new regional minister for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Kentucky. The regional board voted unanimously on Saturday, May 22, to approve the Regional Minister Search Team's recommendation that Rev. Dr. Gillett be called to this position. He [began] this position on Aug. 1.

Rev. Dr. Gillett has deep roots in the Kentucky region, having served the last 22 years as senior pastor of East Second Street Christian Church in Lexington. Since June 2017, he has been the Executive Director of the Kentucky Council of Churches and has served as an adjunct lecturer at Lexington Theological Seminary.

Rev. Dr. Gillett stated, "I am honored and privileged to have been called to regional ministry in Kentucky. I am truly excited and feel called to this ministry at this moment in time and look forward to working with all who make up the Christian Church in Kentucky."

"After an extensive search, the team felt that Rev. Dr. Gillett was the person God was calling to this position," said Rev. Kory Wilcoxson, chair of the Regional Minister Search Team. "His relational nature, his dynamic presence, and his commitment to the health of the region will be a blessing to Kentucky as we move forward."

Rev. Dr. Gillett holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mathematics from Jarvis Christian College in Hawkins, Tex.; a Master of Divinity from McCormick Theological Seminary, Chicago; a Master of Business Administration Degree from Indiana Wesleyan University, Marion, Ind.; and a Doctorate of Ministry Degree from Lexington Theological Seminary.

In addition to his current work, he has extensive experience at the local, regional, and denominational level. He currently serves as the chair of the UCMS Board of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). He...

to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ."

Reverend Dr. Gillett has four children, Jeremy, Liyah, Tasia, and Donald, III (Trey) and one grandchild, Jayda. He is married to Dr. Charisse L. Gillett, President of the Lexington Theological Seminary.

### CARETAKER'S PROJECT LIST

Our new Camp Caretaker, **Denny Flaherty**, is settling in to his new ministry, and he has already identified several projects on the campgrounds where we could use volunteers, to be tackled either at our Fall Work Day or at an alternative time. If a group from your church would be interested in helping with one of the following projects, please call the West Area Office at (270) 821-1332 or email Denny at dennyflaherty@gmail.com.

- 1. Rebuild small vespers seating by dining hall. Power wash stage. Stain seating and stage.
- 2. Clear out debris at old men's restroom and install new door and shelving.
- 3. Move all materials from old women's shower house to old men's shower house. Clean and paint inside.
- 4. Move red rock pile from caretaker's house. Skid Steer will be needed.
- 5. Tear down old concrete pillars and asphalt at front gate and dispose. Direction will be given on work day.
- 6. Install mulch barrier and spread mulch at newer shower houses.
- 7. Build new firewood stand at the pavilion.
- 8. Spread barrier and rock underneath deck at men's shower house.
- 9. Repair all retains walls throughout camp.
- 10. Winterize camp. Put away benches, kayaks and canoes.
- 11. Move concrete steps to caretaker's house.
- 12. Perform screen, electric, and light repairs at cabins.
- 13. Replenish firewood . Fell, buck and split firewood. Power splitter and chain saws will be needed.
- 14. Move material from tractor shed to an area to be determined.
- 15. Clean up trails and camp property of stick and rocks.

# TREASURER'S REPORT

West Area: We had very good receipts from our congregations totaling \$9,836 and a year-to-date total of \$44,937 or 70% of the annual budget. We had very little expenses other than the West Area Minister's items. Our operating income was \$5,878 in excess of expenses bringing our operating cash balance to \$86,466 at month end. Our restricted balance remained at \$2,202.

Camp Kum-Ba-Ya: Our July statement shows a very improved situation over 2020. We ended the month with an operating cash balance of \$55,673 plus a restricted cash balance of \$9,472. Our budgeted receipts for 2021 were \$42,700; however, actual receipts have been \$79,990 thanks to congregational and individual gifts exceeding \$24,000. Also, the federal PPP Loan that was forgiven was \$10,926.

We did not have a caretaker until this month (Jamie Eubanks, Bruce Dobyns, Kerry Frazier and crew filled in the void). And we did not have a Camp Program Manager (Rachel filled this position), so these items helped our bottom line.

Hopefully, 2022 will be easier to budget, and we will get back to normal.

It should be noted that we started 2021 with an operating cash balance of \$8,218 and ended July with \$55,673.
